

# **POLLUTION, POLLUTION, COME OUT, COME OUT, WHEREVER YOU ARE.**



Some pollution is visible, but most is invisible. Pollution that can be seen is called particulate matter. The two chief sources of particulate matter are:

1. Coal burning power plants and factories, and
2. Gasoline burned by vehicles.

Investigate where and why you might find particulate pollution around your school by following the activity below.

## **Materials:**

1. Numerous baby food jars
2. Numerous larger jars in which the baby food jars can fit
3. Petroleum jelly

## **Procedure:**

Smear petroleum jelly all over the smaller jars. Place a small jar into a larger jar. Place the jars in test areas for several days. Complete the observation sheet.
